**OFFICIALS IN FIGHTING FORCES.**

Further evidence of the loyalty of public servants is given to-day through the reproduction in this issue of photographs of members of the Cardiff Town Clerk's staff serving in different parts of the world. Their experiences have been thrilling. Unfortunately in one case those experiences have proved fatal, for early in the war (20th February, 1915) Captain Vivian H. Watkins, Monmouthshire Regiment, died of wounds received on January 15. A photograph of this brave officer adorns one of the corridors of the City Hall, near the Lord Mayor's parlour. Second-Lieutenant P. H. Harrold, Border Regiment, was wounded whilst on a bombing expedition during the advance on the Somme. He is now convalescent at home.
