## Introduction

To complete the commemoration the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Battle of Mametz Wood in 2016, I was asked to research members of the 16<sup>th</sup> (Cardiff City) Battalion of the Welsh Regiment, who lost their lives at Mametz Wood. Some of the names are recorded in the Cardiff City Corporation Roll of Honour and other names I found online at Ancestry.co.uk.

There are a total of 156 names, 131 within the Glamorgan Archives area, with another 20 names outside of this area. I have also found 5 officers whose details I managed to locate. Some names had very little information other than name, rank, regiment and town of birth. The majority of my research has been online in order to find the information that follows. Some of the names have revealed an interesting hidden history of information, whereas other names did not reveal very much at all.

This research isn't by any means complete, and I hope there are members of the public who can contact the Glamorgan Archives to continue the ongoing process of updating this data.

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The 16th (Service) Battalion (Cardiff City), Welsh Regiment was formed in November 1914 by the Lord Mayor and Corporation in Cardiff. It then moved to Colwyn in December of the same year to join the 140<sup>th</sup> Brigade of the 43<sup>rd</sup> Division. On 29<sup>th</sup> April 1915 it became part of the 115<sup>th</sup> Brigade of the 38<sup>th</sup> Division and in August moved to Winchester.

The Battalion mobilised for war in December 1915 and landed at Havre. It was then engaged in various actions on the Western Front, including The Battle of Albert 1916 and the Battles of Pikem and Langemark in 1917. The Battalion was disbanded on 7<sup>th</sup> February 1918 in France.

I have included within the Appendices section, a transcript of the 16<sup>th</sup> Battalion's War Diary at the time of the Battle of Mametz Wood.

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Mametz Wood was the objective of the 38th (Welsh) Division during the First Battle of the Somme. The attack occurred in a northerly direction over a ridge, focusing on the German positions in the wood, between 7<sup>th</sup> July and 12<sup>th</sup> July 1916. On the 7<sup>th</sup> July, the men were halted by machine gun fire before they reached the wood. Further attacks by the 17th Division on 8<sup>th</sup> July failed to improve the position.

Another attack on the 10<sup>th</sup> July was on a larger scale than had been attempted earlier. Despite heavy casualties the fringe of the wood was soon reached and some bayonet fighting took place before the wood was entered and a number of German machine guns silenced. Fighting in the wood was fierce with the Germans giving ground stubbornly.

However, by 12<sup>th</sup> July the wood was effectively cleared of the enemy. The Welsh Division had lost about 4,000 men, killed or wounded in this searing engagement. It would not be used in a massed attack again until 31<sup>st</sup> July 1917.

The wood still stands today, surrounded by farmland. Overgrown shell craters and trenches can still be made out.

He was a member of the Crewys Hall Presbyterian Church and Sunday school and was a keen sportsman.

Buried between Caterpillar Wood and Mametz Wood, 5 miles east of Albert.

Lieut. Richards wrote "He was in action on 7 July and as we had no news of him afterwards he was posted as missing. News has now reached me that his body was found and buried by another regiment. As you are aware, he was a Machine Gunner and I am sorry to say all the men on his gun were either killed or wounded by the explosion of an enemy's shell".

He was a prominent member of the Splott Wesleyan Church and Brotherhood. He married Catherine Keil on 19 July 1914 and had a son Walter John.

PINKARD, Frank Private 2<sup>nd</sup> (69<sup>th</sup> Foot) Welsh Regiment; son of Walter and Mary Pinkard (as above); born on 7 October 1888 and educated at Moorland Road Council School; was employed for many years by Messrs. Hall, Lewis & Co., Wagon Builders and was afterwards a worker at the Cardiff Docks. Enlisted on 15 January 1915, served with the Expeditionary Force in France & Flanders from 4<sup>th</sup> May and was killed in action during the Battle of Loos on 25 September 1915. ## 16<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Welsh Regiment War Diaries 27 June – 21 July 1916

- 27<sup>th</sup> June 1916      Battalion arrived FORTEL. Paraded at 7:45pm and marched during night 27<sup>th</sup>/28<sup>th</sup> to AUTHEUX via BARLY & OUTREBOIS.
- 28<sup>th</sup> June 1916      Battalion billeted at AUTHEUX. Inspection of Billets, arms and equipment.
- 29<sup>th</sup> June 1916      Company inspections of Billets, arms and equipment.  
Capt. *Unknown* from First Army School of Instruction took over Command and pay of 'D' Company.
- 30<sup>th</sup> June 1916      Battalion billeted in hutments at TOUTEN COURT.  
No 23437 Pte M O'Regan, No 23111 Pte A G Walls, No 49944 Pte E W Sharinan went this day transferred to 38 Division Infantry Base Depot under Army Council Instruction 1186 12/6/16, being under age.

- 1<sup>st</sup> July 1916      Battn in hutments – TOUTENCOURT
- 2<sup>nd</sup> July 1916      Battn paraded for inspection of arms and equipment. Battn moved to ACHEUX, arriving at 12 midnight. Under Canvas
- 3<sup>rd</sup> July 1916      Inspection of arms, equipment and lines. Battn moved to BUIRE s/L'ANCRE. Under canvas.
- 4<sup>th</sup> July 1916      Inspection of arms, equipment, Gas Helmets, goggles and lines.
- 5<sup>th</sup> July 1916      Brigade moved at 1:30pm via MEAULTE, BECORDELBECOURT to CARNOY. Bivouacs. From BECORDEL-BECOUAT Brigade moved by Battalions at half hour intervals. Party of 8 Officers in three groups, sent out as reconnaissance Party to reconnoitre approaches to new British position at QUEEN'S NULLAH. Party heavily shelled: 2 officers killed, two wounded.
- 6<sup>th</sup> July 1916      Letter read from Gen. Sir Ivor Philips to units of 38<sup>th</sup> Division.  
In evening Batt proceeded via CARNOY; TRIANGLE; LOOP; LOOP TRENCH; MONTAUBAN ALLEY & CATERPILLAR TRENCH to Valley N of CATERPILLAR WOOD. Between them and MAMETZ WOOD there was a slope which hid them from enemy's view.
- 7<sup>th</sup> July 1916      8:30am Battn, under orders, drawn up on their own side of slope facing MAMETZ WOOD in lines of platoons with a 2 platoon frontage. 11 SWB in support. 10 SWB in reserve. Own Artillery ceased firing at Wood at 8:30am, and first lines of Battn proceeded over the crest of the slope but came instantly under heavy Machine Gun frontal fire from MAMETZ WOOD and enfilade fire from PLATIRON COPSE and SABOT COPSE and the German second System, which ran between MAMETZ WOOD and BAZENTIN LE PETIT WOOD. Battn suffered heavily, and had to withdraw to their own side of the crest. Battn made two more attacks, but position was much too exposed for any hope of success, and orders were received to cease operations. 11<sup>th</sup> SWB attempted to approach the WOOD through a gully running between CATERPILLAR WOOD and slope mentioned above, but Machine Gun fire drove them back. **Our losses: 6 Officers killed, 6 wounded, 268 Ordinary Ranks (OR's) killed, missing or wounded.**

Weather very wet, this adding greatly to exhaustion of troops. Battn received orders to return to their Bivouac. Moved off 10:30pm. Arrived 4am.

8<sup>th</sup> July 1916 Roll call at Noon. Verbal appreciation on behaviour of troops from Brig. Gen. Evans communicated to Battalion.

10<sup>th</sup> July 1916 Battalion "stood to" at 3am as Reserve to 113 and 114 Infantry Brigades, who attached MAMETZ WOOD from South, with success, but heavy casualties. About 9pm Battn received orders to reinforce 113 & 114 Brigades in MAMETZ WOOD. Reached WOOD about 11pm, and reported to Brigadier General Marden, under whose orders they operated until arrival of Brig. Gen. Evans the following morning, under Brig. Gen Evans' instruction, Battn took up position along Railway running through Western side of WOOD, with the right flank about 300 yards from North end of the WOOD. On the right of Battn were 17<sup>th</sup> RWF and on left the 15<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> Battns RWF; on Eastern side of Central drive through the WOOD were 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> SWB. The line was subsequently altered, so that Batt held a position parallel with Northern edge of WOOD at about 300 yards distance from N of WOOD. 17<sup>th</sup> RWF on their right running as far as central drive. 10<sup>th</sup> Welsh came in on their left and 16<sup>th</sup> RWF relieved 15<sup>th</sup> RWF. The line dug itself in.

Line received orders to advance to Northern, North Eastern and North Western edges of WOOD, attach to start 3pm; but 20 mins before 3pm our Artillery set up terrific barrage which caught our line; many casualties to Officers and O.R's and Battn rather shaken. 10<sup>th</sup> Welsh moved forward later in the afternoon to the North Western line of the WOOD, but owing to weakness in numbers of the 17<sup>th</sup> RWF, our Battn had orders to hold the line, and proceeded to improve their positions.

6pm. Enemy commenced to bombard our positions with 5.9's and kept this up ceaselessly. After dark 10<sup>th</sup> Welsh returned to original line, having been driven back by Minenwerfen and thereafter in addition to 5.9's, enemy bombarded own front with gas shells and Minenwerfer.

12<sup>th</sup> July 1916 This lasted incessantly until Battn was relieved at about 6am by a Battn of the Northumberland Fusiliers, 21 Division. Battn returned to bivouac under heavy shell fire.

**Casualties: 1 Officer killed, 2 Officers wounded, 3 Officers suffering from Shell Shock. 67 OR's killed and wounded.**

13<sup>th</sup> July 1916 4:30am. Brigade moved off to WARLOY, via MEAULTE, BUIRE s/L'ANCRE, RIBEMONT. Arrived IVARLOY 12 noon. Battn in billets.  
6pm Battn transported by Motor Lorries to COUIN. Arrived 11:30pm. Bivouacs.

14<sup>th</sup> July 1916 11:45am Battn addressed by Lieut. General Hunter-Weston, commanding 8<sup>th</sup> Army Corps.  
3pm Battn moved via COURCELLES 7 COLINCAMPS to relieve 8<sup>th</sup> Worcester Regiment (48<sup>th</sup> Division) in right sub-sector of line. (HEBUTERNE SECTION).

15<sup>th</sup> July 1916 Quiet. Clearing of approaches to Front Line commenced, also building and wiring of Strong Points in Front Line, which had been destroyed by recent heavy bombardment.

16<sup>th</sup> July 1916 Quiet. Above work continued.

17<sup>th</sup> July 1916 Quiet. Above work continued. Enemy Machine Guns and trench Mortar active at times.



- 18<sup>th</sup> July 1916 2:40am Party of 2 Officers and 44 OR's made a raid on Enemy Lines. Encountered strong Working Party, who retired to their lines, but returned after sometime & whereupon our Party bombed them with success, and returned to own lines. **Casualties: 2 OR's wounded; 4 OR's missing.** Heavy rain: trenches in very bad state. Work of repairing very difficult. 4pm Battn relieved by 17<sup>th</sup> RWF. Battn returned to COURCELLES to billets.
- 19<sup>th</sup> July 1916 Inspection of Arms, Equipment & Billets. Working Party found for wiring of Front Line.
- 20<sup>th</sup> July 1916 am - Battn bathed at COUIN.  
Pm – Working Parties sent to work under orders of 17<sup>th</sup> RWF.  
Night – Working Parties sent to work under orders of 17<sup>th</sup> RWF.
- 21<sup>st</sup> July 1916 Company pay. Inspection Arms, Equipment & Billets etc. Working and Wiring Parties as on 20<sup>th</sup>.



## The Thiepval Memorial



The Thiepval Memorial to the Missing of the Somme battlefields bears the names of 72,194 officers and men of the United Kingdom and South African forces. Over 90 percent of those commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial died in the 1916 Battles of the Somme between July and November 1916.

The Thiepval memorial serves as an Anglo-French Battle Memorial. It was designed as an arch representing the alliance of Britain and France in the Somme 1916 offensive against the German defensive Front.

The Thiepval memorial was designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens. It was built in red brick and limestone between 1928 and 1932.

The memorial is located on a high ridge of ground and the top of the memorial can be clearly seen from various points of high ground in the centre and northern sectors of the 1916 Somme battlefields. The 72,194 names of the men missing in action on the battlefield of the Somme are inscribed on 64 huge stone panels, which form each of the four faces of a total of 16 piers for the building.

The name of each man commemorated on the memorial can be found in the Memorial Registers. These are a series of books listing the casualties on this memorial in alphabetical order. The Memorial Registers are located in brass register boxes at the foot of the memorial by the steps leading to the Stone of Remembrance and on the terrace at the west end of the Memorial. The Memorial Registers are provided by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC).

The Memorial Register entry will usually provide (where known) most of the following details for an individual:

Surname; Rank; Initial(s); Service Number; Unit; Regiment/Service; Killed in action or Died of wounds; Date of Death; Age; Next of kin and address; and Memorial Reference.

The Thiepval Memorial was unveiled on 31<sup>st</sup> July 1932 by Prince Edward, Prince of Wales. The new President of France, Albert Lebrun, was also officiating at the ceremony.

On the early morning of 1<sup>st</sup> July 1916, thirteen divisions of British forces launched an offensive on a line from north of Gommecourt to Maricourt at the River Somme. South of the river the attack was made by the French Army. The attack was preceded by a preliminary bombardment lasting seven days from 24<sup>th</sup> June. Although the German Front Line and rear positions were damaged by the Allied artillery during this time, and the Germans' nerves were severely tested by the end of the seven days, the German barbed wire defences were not as badly damaged as had been intended.

In the southern sector of the British attack, from Mametz village to Montauban village, the German defence did crumble and the British reached their objective there by the end of 1<sup>st</sup> July. However, in most other parts of the line the German defence held out and the British met with unexpected resistance from well-placed machine guns. In the far north of the sector from Gommecourt to Thiepval, numerous large bunkers dug deep underneath the chalk downs had provided enough protection in key strongpoint locations, such as Gommecourt, Serre, Beaumont-Hamel and Thiepval, for those German troops to survive the preliminary bombardment with few casualties. The losses to the British on the first day of the attack were unprecedented for the British Army, with approximately 58,000 casualties for that day alone including 19,000 of them being killed.

In the following weeks, the British continued to attack the German line in smaller-scale attacks with limited objectives. The German Army put up a stubborn resistance for every inch of ground. The battles of the Somme 1916 carried on over a period of several months from the first day of July to the middle of November. Every village, hamlet, farmhouse, wood and copse were fought over until the winter weather closed in. Only a few miles of ground were gained by the British by the end of the Battles of the Somme and huge numbers of men had been wounded or killed on both sides.

The names of quiet, rural villages and woods on the gently rolling chalk downs north of the Somme River became names associated with famous battles of 1916. In British military history these names would become synonymous with the sacrifice and bravery of the officers and men of the British Army and the Dominion Forces of Australia, Newfoundland, New Zealand and South Africa. The Thiepval Memorial carries the names of these battles on the corners of the piers: Albert, Gommecourt, Serre, Bazentin Ridge, Delville Wood, Pozières, Guillemont, Ginchy, Flers-Courcelette, Morval, Thiepval, Le Transloy, Ancre Heights.
