General Information

The Tabernacle Welsh Language Baptist Chapel in The Hayes, in the Centre of Cardiff, is a Grade II listed building. The Chapel has existed on the site from 1821, enlarged in 1840, further enlarged and rebuilt, between 1862 to 1865, in an Italianate style.

The front of the building is set back from the main road behind a forecourt, fronted with wrought iron railings and two gate pillars.
