Lieutenants A & L Tregaskis, Welsh Regiment, have both been killed in action. Their father is Mr G H Tregaskis of Taff's Well, a director of Spillers Nephews (Ltd). News relating to the death of Lieutenant Leonard Tregaskis was received at his home on Wednesday morning from the War Office, the message reading as follows:

'Deeply regret to inform you that Lieutenant Leonard Tregaskis, of the Welsh Regiment, was killed in action on July 8. Army Council express their sympathy.'

A similar telegram was received later respecting the death of Lieutenant Arthur Tregaskis. At the outbreak of war, the deceased officers returned home from Canada, travelling 5,000 miles to enlist.

Lieutenant Leonard Tregaskis was employed by Spillers & Bakers for thirteen years, and emigrated to Canada in 1913. He was a keen motorist and an old member of the Whitchurch Hockey Club.

In their last letter, which was received at their home only a few days ago, the deceased officers stated that "things were becoming interesting".
