Welsh Missionary's Death

The death occurred on Sunday night at the Denmark Hill Hospital, London of the Rev. David Morris Rees, the famous Welsh missionary, who had served in the Madagascan Mission Field for 35 years. Born in Fronlwyd, Carmarthenshire, he spent his early years in Pentre, Rhondda Valley. He was brother to Mrs Phillips and an uncle to Mr Haydn Morris Brynnmeurig, Parcmain, Carmarthen.

On the conclusion of his missionary work he came home intending to undergo an operation, but this was found inadvisable, and he remained to the end at the Denmark Hill Hospital. He is survived by a widow and two daughters, Mrs Henry Thomas, Godreaman, and Miss Rees BA. The funeral took place on Tuesday afternoon in the Islington section of the Finchley Cemetery.

A similar telegram was received later respecting the death of Lieutenant Arthur Tregaskis. At the outbreak of war, the deceased officers returned home from Canada, travelling 5,000 miles to enlist. Lieutenant Leonard Tregaskis was employed by Spillers & Bakers for thirteen years, and emigrated to Canada in 1913. He was a keen motorist and an old member of the Whitchurch Hockey Club.
