Herbert had served as a Sapper in the Royal Engineers prior to being Commissioned 2nd Lt on 18 April 1915 into the 2nd Battalion, Welsh Regiment. He was posted to the 18th Batt from July 1915 and promoted Lt and moved to the 16th Batt on 1 July 1917. He was then transferred to 13th Batt on 2 August 1918, joining the Reinforcement Camp at Rouen. From here his posting was changed to the 15th Batt, and he joined them during their drive from Albert on 28 August 1918, serving with the Batt until after the Armistice. Herbert was awarded the British War and Victory Medals for his service, which was sent to him at 'Glamorgan House', Mary Street, Porthcawl.
